Today our Public Health Team awarded Darton Academy with the Healthier Futures Accreditation, making it the first secondary school to achieve the accreditation.

The Healthier Futures Accreditation recognises schools and educational settings that are committed to supporting the health and wellbeing of their children and young people. Schools can achieve the accreditation through an online platform where they receive feedback on four key pillars; physical activity, emotional health and wellbeing, food, drink and oral health, and PSHE.

Achieving the accreditation not only recognises schools for their work to support health and wellbeing, but it also helps them to provide better support going forward.

For Darton Academy, the accreditation has been key in helping to promote healthier options among students. Working with our public health team has strengthened the academy's relationships with healthcare services, providing students with valuable opportunities to engage with expert advice from public health professionals.

Through the accreditation, the academy has also learned how important it is to have a coordinated and adaptable approach to supporting students and preparing them for life beyond the classroom. Lessons and activities are now more thoroughly informed by the resources the school have developed, adopted, or adapted as part of the accreditation process.

Cllr Wendy Cain, Cabinet Spokesperson for Public Health and Communities, said: "We want children and young people in Barnsley to enjoy a life of good physical and mental health, and our Healthier Futures Accreditation means we can get schools and settings on board to help make this happen. We're really proud of Darton Academy for achieving the accreditation. This recognition highlights their commitment to fostering a healthy and supportive environment for their students, and by working with our public health team, the academy has set a remarkable example for other schools in our community."

A Journey Through Time: Students Students Explore the Wonders of Rome





Students from Darton, De Warenne, Garforth, and The Vale Academies are now in their second year of studying Latin Language and Civilisation, working towards their GCSE.

While learning about ancient Rome from a textbook offers valuable insights, nothing compares to walking in the footsteps of the Romans themselves! Thanks to the support of The Latin Excellence Programme and funding from The Department for Education, 53 students and 8 staff members had the unforgettable opportunity to experience history firsthand during a four-day residential trip to the Eternal City.

Departing in the early hours of Thursday, 27th February, and returning on Monday, 3rd March, the group embarked on a jampacked adventure that brought Roman history to life. The trip was a journey through time, with students standing in the mighty Colosseum, wandering the ruins of the Roman Forum, and marvelling at the grandeur of the Pantheon. The group also explored the National Roman Museum and the Baths of Diocletian, uncovering ancient artifacts that deepened their appreciation of Roman civilisation. Every moment spent in the heart of Rome was a powerful immersion into the past.



The educational journey wasn't all about history, however – there was plenty of time to experience the beauty of modern Rome too. Students and staff enjoyed breathtaking views at Villa Borghese Park, relaxed in the lively Piazza Navona, and indulged in endless servings of authentic Italian gelato.

While the four academies have previously come together at Latin Conferences held at Education House, this trip was the first real opportunity for students to connect beyond the classroom. The experience was embraced wholeheartedly by all, with students forging new friendships and showing great respect for both staff and fellow travellers.

Two representatives from PGL Beyond also accompanied the group to observe the trip and explore ways to enhance school travel experiences. Their verdict? A resounding success! They were thoroughly impressed by the students' engagement and the powerful impact of multi-school educational trips.
